We have such **happy times** with our pastors and the sponsored children within their care. This is how we keep in touch with their progress, of course, as changes occur and are not always good.

Do you remember the **family** who were in danger of losing their small house because the dad had made some very bad decisions and got himself into lots of debt? They did eventually lose their house, so now they are renting and Dad is working (not a skilled job) to pay off the debt. They are trying to do this without additional help, except for the fact that the children are sponsored. We are monitoring the situation to make sure the children are cared for.

Yesaya has accepted the responsibility for another church, which means he now has two to look after.... The pastor was very old and he retired. Yesaya is still young and energetic. He's a great person and he looks after a small group of sponsored children.

The day we visited the **school**, **Endang**, the Principal, was in a bit of a state because she had just found out someone had been hacking into their electricity supply and she had an emormous bill to pay. We helped with

funds for this, of course, because the bill had to be paid that day or the supply would be cut off!! Just another event in the day of the school!

His name is **Fidel Francis**, born on 28th May, 2013. He is in kindergarten at the moment and is needing sponsorship to be able to move on next year to grade 1. If you know someone who might like to sponsor him, please let me know, thank you.

He is now 29 years of age and enjoying life as a well-employed young
