Java Journey 2018 - 18th July - 4th August

Jogjakarta is the capital of Central Java and a very large, sprawling city which is popular with tourists. It has been subject to earthquakes and eruptions of a nearby volcano. It's very colourful and noisy. However, we now have a growing group of sponsored children around the city of Jogjakarta and we hope to see some of them, even though the children will still be on school holidays whilst we are there. School will resume as we continue our journey. The group is overseen by Sylvia - Petrus' daughter - and her husband, Darwin. We will spend time with them and hear about their efforts to help the children. Sylvia, herself, was once sponsored through school and has studied at University. She and Darwin both have good jobs.

We will also be tourists and will visit some of the local sights and cultural monuments.

From Jogjakarta we drive almost half way to Malang and stay in the lovely town of Sarangan. We used to drive to

Some of our sponsored children will come to us there and we will all go to the Safari Park, not too far away. It's a long day - and tiring - but so good! The Plantation manager, who knows us well, will take us to visit various curious and interesting places on and around the Plantation. We also participate in English lessons for the workers in the office and management, so they can use some English in the course of their work with tourists. It's fun!

Then it's on to Malang and the main focus of our journey. We visit many pastors and many groups of sponsored children. We like to play games with the children and make them laugh. We'll give them a little gift, which we have bought and prepared. The pastors and their wives also think all this is fun! We have wonderful meals together! They know how to cook the local produce. Then go outside and pick a pineapple for us to eat! Delicious. Not to mention bananas! All too soon it is time to leave for home, having seen and appreciated the work of Hope For The Children.

	Sponsorship is - for children - Yearly \$240, half-yearly \$120, quarterly \$60, or monthly \$20. You may use a Direct Credit facility at the Bank - ask me for details. For University students - \$300 yearly, for 2-4 years depending on the course. For Pastors - \$400 yearly, for 4-5 years maximum Sponsorship pays for all educational and scout expenses - books, shoes, uniforms, etc. plus all medical and dental expenses and one good 'going out' set of clothes a year. We give food parcels at various times. Please mark your sponsorship 'due date' on your calendar each year - and I will put a small reminder in your newsletter if necessary. Many thanks.
