Two children here, same age, different grades.....

Petrus now has his new glasses and can read and write well! He is so grateful and happy about that! It was a very long road to this end. He had the stitches out just before we arrived and now... success.



We met this family who live very simply in the forest. Their house is very poor. It amounts to a 'lean to' hut and houses five people. They have had to carry water to the house from a spring further into the forest. So every day they go to the spring and fill up the buckets to take back to the house. As you can see, Mum is carrying one on her head, (a usual mode of carrying a load for a woman) and dad has buckets hanging on each end of a pole balanced across his shoulders. All he dreamed of was having piped water to their house! So we gave him enough money to purchase these and I have had a letter saying he has bought the pipes, the connecting pieces and the tap, so he's put them together and now they have running water, with a tap, right to their door! How blessed we are for having this opportunity to bring such pleasure to this little family. AND, how much do we take for granted in our comfortable lives?





My aim here is to show you the state of their house, where, I might say, they appear to live happily in a Christian community without seeking assistance from others. I'm not asking for a fund for this family, as now the school age boy is sponsored and we will keep in touch with them. We will be able to help them from time to time and hopefully make their life easier as they grow older. The children will be given more opportunities as they get older, also. I wanted to show you an extremely poor rural family making the most of their situation. They are living peaceably in their isolation.
